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Election Regulation of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of the Maldives

| Introduction and Name | 1. | (a) | This Regulation is formulated and published under Section 38(a)(1) of the Chartered Accountants Act (Act Number 13/2020) to provide the general procedure and rules for the arrangement of the elections for the Council of the Institute of Chartered Accountants. |
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|  |  | (b) | This Regulation shall be cited as the "Election Regulation of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of the Maldives." |
| General | 2. | (a) | Pursuant to section 18(a), (b) of Chartered Accountants Act, the following Council Members of the Institute shall be elected by secret vote of the members of the Institute during the council election of the Institute held at least 60 (Sixty) days before the expiry of the term of the incumbent Council. |
|  |  |  | (i) President of the Council |
|  |  |  | (ii) Vice President of the Council |
|  |  |  | (iii) Four General Council Members |
|  |  | (b) | Although an election for the Council of the Institute is held in accordance with subsection (a), the incumbent Council Members shall remain in their post until the expiry of their term. |
|  |  | (c) | The incumbent Interim Council, established as per Section 37 of the Act, shall hold an election before the end of the interim period, in accordance with this regulation. |
|  |  | (d) | If a post of the Council of the Institute becomes vacant prior to the end of the term and more than 6 (Six) months are left until the expiry of the term, a new member must be elected during the council election of the Institute to fill the vacancy within 60 (Sixty) days of the post becoming vacant. Where less than 6 (Six) months are left until the expiry of the term of the post of the Council of the Institute, the incumbent Council shall appoint a member to the vacant post in accordance with Section 20(b) of the Act. |
| Mode of Voting | 3. | (a) | Elections under this Regulation shall be held by way of voting system determined in consultation with the Elections Commission of the Maldives. Voters can attend the council election of the Institute in which elections are to be held either in-person or online, and vote through the determined voting system. |

| Opening <br> Applications <br> for Candidacy | 7. | (a) | Where an election is to be held due to the expiry of the term <br> of the incumbent Council, the Elections Committee must <br> announce the opening for applications of members of the |
| Institute interested in running for the election, 30 (thirty) days |  |  |  |
| prior to the election date. |  |  |  |


| Announceme nt of Candidates | 10. | (a) | The Elections Committee must announce the details of the candidates of the election within maximum 3 (three) days after the deadline for the submission of applications for candidacy under Section 7 of this Regulation has passed. |

|  |  | (b) | In announcing the names of the candidates pursuant to subsection (a), the names of the candidates must be in the order determined by drawing lots between the candidates who fulfil the requisite requirements of candidacy. The drawing of lots shall be conducted in the presence of the candidates or a representative of the candidates. If a candidate or a representative of the candidate fails to attend such draw, the Elections Committee has the discretion to draw lots in the presence of a representative appointed by the Elections Committee. |
| Withdrawal of Candidacy | 11. | If a candidate running for an election of the Council Members wishes to withdraw their candidacy, they may do so prior to the announcement of the candidates after the process of drawing lots to order the names of the candidates. |  |
| Elected Members | 12. | The candidate that gets elected for the post they run for in the elections of the Council Members shall be the candidate who receives the highest number of votes amongst applicants contending for the same post. |  |
| Announceme nt of Results | 13. | (a) | Following the conclusion of the designated voting period in the election, the provisional results must be announced within 5 hours after the closing of the ballot. |
|  |  | (b) | Final results shall be announced within 3 (Three) days from the date of the election and shall be published in the Government Gazette. |
| Additional Rounds of Election | 14. | In the event of a tie between two or more candidates running for the same post, an additional round of election with the candidates that tied must be held within a maximum of 3 (Three) days after the announcement of the official results of the first round. This process shall continue until the requisite number of members for a post has been elected. |  |
| Uncontested Election | 15. | (a) | In cases where a candidate is running uncontested for a position, members shall cast a yes/no vote for the candidate. The candidate will be elected if the majority of voters vote "yes" for the candidate. |
|  |  | (b) | Where the post of the Council requires more than 1 (One) Member and candidates who applied for the post are less than or equal to the requisite number of Members for the post, they shall be elected in the instance they receive the votes of the |
